

HUMAN TRAFFICKING DEFINED

Defined by 3 components:

Defined in 3 words: Exploitation for profit or sexual gratification

1. VALUE EXCHANGED

Something of value must be exchanged.
This could be money, food, shelter, drugs, alcohol, clothes or any transactional piece.

2. FORCE, FRAUD, COERCION...

FORCE

physical violence: restraint, confinement, use of a weapon, inflicting physical harm, kidnapping, and rape to force the victim into submission.

FRAUD

false promise: such as a modeling opportunity, marriage or a better life.

COERCION

threat of serious harm or physical restraint; a scheme leading victims to believe the failure to perform would result in harm to any person; or threatened abuse or abuse

...& SEX/AGE EXCEPTION

If a victim of sex trafficking is a minor (under 18), **force**, **fraud**, **and coercion do not need to be present**.

Although the age of consent is 16 in South Carolina, a minor cannot consent to commercial sex.

3. TYPES OF TRAFFICKING

SEX

Involves a sex act

Involuntary Servitude
Debt Bondage
Forced Servitude

ORGAN

The sale of organs is illegal under S.C. and federal law; however, organ trafficking is considered part of "trafficking in persons" by the United Nations Trafficking in Persons Protocol
